### Disabled students allowance (DSA)

• with a disability, long term health condition (including mental health)

# What is DSA?

- DSAs are available to pay for support for students
  long-term conditions, visual and Deaf or hard-of-hearing, Autism
- The funding pays for the support rather than going directly
- DSA is additional to other support you may already
- The funds are for additional study costs that a student incurs

- The funding is made up of four different types of support;
- DSA pays the funding directly to approved suppliers to cover

### Non-medical helpers

- Specialist one-to-one study skills support
- Specialist one-to-one mentoring support
- Specialist one-to-one support for hearing impaired or visually impaired students
- Notetaking support (for students who are blind, visually impaired, Deaf or hard-of-hearing)
- Mobility training/sighted guide support (for students who are blind or visually impaired)
- BSL interpreters, Lipreaders
- Assistive technology training
